It also describes how your classroom, school, or organization can collect new books to serve as holiday gifts for children in our community who do not have the privilege of having books in their homes or receiving holiday gifts. Please consider having a Book Shower at your school or in your classroom to help with this literacy project!!

MID-State members can also contribute to this project by serving as volunteers at the book distribution at the Salvation Army before the holidays. The new books collected through Book Showers are given to

Brotherhood Tree recipients and also distributed through the Salvation Army Christmas Clearinghouse and social service agencies that work with low-income families, the homeless, and children at risk.

As volunteers, we would assist parents who come to the Salvation Army's Toy Distribution to choose a book for each child in their family as another holiday gift. The dates and times that volunteers are needed are December 20th from 1 to 7 p.m. and December 21 from 9:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at Youth Build in the Crossroads Center (formerly the Outlet Mall) in Normal. Sheila Diaz, the chair of this literacy initiative, will set

up two hour shifts for volunteers to work on these dates. Who: Organizations, clubs, churches, scout troops, schools, businesses, and other interested


groups.

Where: At your regularly scheduled meetings, at a special event, or through drop-off boxes in your buildings.

How: Hold a Book Shower at your organization, club, school, or church to collect new children's books that will become holiday gifts for underprivileged children. STAR Literacy Program is accepting donations of new children's books. Please note: We will not be accepting donations of used books this year. The new children's books will be distributed through the Salvation Army Christmas Clearinghouse and social service agencies that work with low-income families, the homeless, and children at risk. In November and December at both Bloomington and Normal Public Libraries and the Children's Discovery Museum will accept new book donations. Barnes and Noble Booksellers is holding a Book Drive to benefit Book Showers. Books can be purchased at each register and left at the store for pick up.
