YOUNG AUTHOR CELEBRATION APRIL 27, 2017

General Requirements

• Open to all students in grades K - 8

Student manuscripts must be:

- · Poem, book, or short story of any length
- Written during the 2016-2017 school year
- Result of class assignments or individual creative writing
- · Written at school
- The student's original work
- · Illustrations are allowed
- Composed by an individual or by 2 authors only- Please note that co-authored work counts as two of the district's allotted entries.

Eligibility:

• Each building may send 6 authors or 1 author for every 30 students enrolled, whichever is

greater. (example: A school of 100 students is eligible to send 6 authors; a school with 300 students enrolled is eligible to send 10 authors)

- Each district may determine the manner in which manuscripts are selected. Refer to the timeline for recommended guidelines, as well as important dates.
- The district is responsible for notifying its eligible participants and informing them of registration procedures for the session. A completed registration form and the registration fee must be submitted for each participant by April 14, 2017.
- One adult per young author is welcome to attend. Two tickets per author will be issued.
- Manuscripts will be on display for sessions.
 Please send them with a school representative on the day of the celebration. Manuscripts will not be returned. All manuscripts are donated to local hospitals and retirement homes for the enjoyment of others.
- Write name, grade level & school on each manuscript.

TIMELINE:

- 1. **ASAP:** Complete the RSVP form by clicking <u>here</u> or visiting <u>https://goo.gl/forms/upfl217xoSS1HRxS2</u>
- 2. End of March: Manuscript entries should be submitted to your school's YA committee.
- 3. **Beginning of April:** Your committee should meet to select winning manuscripts.
- 4. **No later than April 14:** Send the completed registration form, fee of \$18 per student, and list of student authors and their grade levels.
- 5. **The week of the event:** Send home a reminder letter with students, including all pertinent information for the families.

- 1. After choosing your student authors, send a note home to parents that includes necessary general information. (*see sample below)
- 2. Several days before the event, send home a reminder letter explaining registration procedures. (**see sample right)
- 3. Include the address and phone number of the Grand Bear Resort in your communication.
- 4. Give a copy of any parent communication to your school secretary and principal in case they are in the position of fielding questions from parents.
